Much to our dismay, 3 months after moving into our new home, we received a letter stating that redistricting is being considered. I would like to know how recent the historical data that is used in the formula to calculate the number of students that would be attending Heritage in the future is. If it is based on a Census, that is taken every 10 years, is it accurate and reliable? I would also like to know what other identifying factors go into the formula. Is it verifiable that the proposed students from the new home communities are actually real people of high school age, that will choose Heritage, or is the formula based on hypothetical and or historical data?</p> <p>Relocating in the middle of a pandemic, quarantining many times, and getting acclimated to a new town is no small feat. Now that my student has built relationships with staff and peers, and has enjoyed and thrived in the academic rigor of Heritage High in the Cambridge program, redistricting would force my student to begin again. As much as society would like to believe children are resilient, adolescents do not always transition well.</p> <p>Furthermore, redistricting forces parents to struggle to find reliable transportation for students should they continue at Heritage while striving to arrive at their posts on time at their jobs.
