

Physical Aggression (114 & 109)	Fighting (FIT)	Simple Battery (PHA)	Aggravated battery (BAT)
<p>Definition: an individual participating in a non-mutual inappropriate and/or aggressive physical contact with aggressive intent towards another student or School Board employee resulting in no injury. Behavior does not meet the criteria of a Simple Battery (PHA) SESIR incident.</p> <p>Examples to include, but not limited to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Student or other delivering a single poke to the chest. • Student or other delivers a single, non-injuring strike to the arm of another. • Horseplay, low-level pushing and shoving between students. • Student or other engaging in a fight/combat with another and physical intervention is necessary to stop it. • Student becoming engaged in a fight which results in the need for first aid or medical attention for one or both of the participants. (Refer to Fighting as a possible SESIR code). 	<p>Definition: when two or more persons mutually participate in use of force or physical violence that requires either physical intervention or results in injury requiring first aid or medical attention. Lower-level fights, including pushing, shoving, or altercations that stop on verbal command are not required to be reported in SESIR.</p> <p>Examples to include, but not limited to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Student or other engaging in a fight/combat with another and physical intervention is necessary to stop it. • Student becoming engaged in a fight which results in the need for first aid or medical attention for one or both of the participants. 	<p>Definition: an actual and intentional touching or striking of another person against his or her will, or the intentional causing of bodily harm to an individual.</p> <p>Examples to include, but not limited to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Throwing an object and hitting someone hard enough to cause injury. • Aggressively punching another person in the face. • Student committing a battery upon a school district employee such as a teacher or other staff person. 	<p>Definition: a battery where the attacker intentionally or knowingly causes more serious injury as defined in Rule 6A-1.0017 (8)(g) of this rule; such as: great bodily harm, permanent disability, or permanent disfigurement; uses a deadly weapon; or where the attacker knew or should have known the victim was pregnant or an attack on any other individual when the force or violence is carried out against a person who is not fighting back.</p> <p>Examples to include, but not limited to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Student hitting another with a heavy object over the head resulting in serious injury. • Student jabbing a pen into another's arm resulting in serious injury. • Student or other engaging in a mutual physical altercation with another and continuing to hit/beat that person even after that person stops fighting, or is no longer able to fight back resulting in serious injury. • Student committing aggravated battery upon a school district employee such as a teacher or other staff person.
